Endorsement of Carers Australia submission

AAG endorses the Carers Australia submission to this consultation.

AAG comments

AAG raises the following additional issue for consideration.

We acknowledge that the proposed carer support service is designed to address the general needs of all carers. However, we believe there should be greater consideration given to identifying and addressing the specific needs of carers of older people (particularly those with dementia) and carers who are older people themselves.

We note that the draft service delivery model (at page 38) refers to ensuring that service delivery meets the needs of "*particular cohorts of carers*" including those from CALD, ATSI and LGBTI backgrounds. The model also notes (at page 36) that access to face-to-face needs assessment and targeted financial support will be limited to "*people with a specific need*" or cultural sensitivity.

We suggest that the terms "particular cohorts of carers" and/or "people with a specific need" should be defined to include carers of older people (particularly those with dementia) and carers who are older people themselves.
