Draft Mandurah EY Plan for comment - developed by Gail Clark

Problem:

One in three children living in Halls Head (Mandurah) enter school developmentally vulnerable, as measured by the Australian Early Development Census, well above the State average. Research suggests the best opportunity to build strong foundations for life long learning occurs in early childhood - the period of conception, throughout pregnancy, and during a child's first three to five years. Optimising early childhood development requires a collaborative and holistic approach to policy, programs and services.

A lack of a community hub and/or playgroup minimises the opportunity for parents/families and young children to connect with other families and children in the community, and/or link in with other early years services

A lack of connection between schools, early childhood education and care services and playgroups which impacts on continuity of learning, transition to school programs and sharing vital information between services to address issues early

Utlimate outcomes:

 $Children\ living\ in\ Halls\ Head\ enter\ school\ with\ the\ basic\ competencies\ and\ schools\ that\ enable\ them\ to\ thrive.$

The percentage of children developmentally vulnerable on one or more domains decreases over time.
