



Why are we writing an Early Years Strategy?

The Australian Government is writing an *Early Years Strategy*.



An Early Years Strategy means a plan about how to help children do well in life.



The Strategy focuses on

- children aged 0 to 5 years
- babies who will be born.

We want every child in Australia to


• have a good start to life

Your ideas will help us to make good plans.














We want to know what is important to different people living in Australia. For example

 - CALD means people with different cultures and languages
- people who live far away from a city
- people from the *LGBTQIA+* community
 - LGBTQIA+ means people with different genders and sexualities.

When young children have what they need, they have the opportunity to do well in life.




We will make a Strategy



A Strategy will help children in Australia to

• learn





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- do well.

The Strategy will have a *Commonwealth* Government focus.

Commonwealth means Australian Government.









All areas of the Commonwealth Government will work together

The Government helps children and families in different ways.

For example

- healthcare services
- law services
- education services
- extra help with money.

The Government also has programs to help children and families who are *disadvantaged*. For example

• First Nations people





• people with disability.

Disadvantaged means people do **not** have the same opportunities as others in society.



We want different areas of the Government to work together to give the best services to children and families.



For example, the Department of Health and Department of Education worked together to make the Connected Beginnings program.



This program helps First Nations children get health and education services so they are ready for school.

The Strategy will work with other Government strategies



We will get good results when different Government strategies work together.

We will protect the rights of children



The Strategy will follow *United Nations Conventions* to protect the rights of all children.

United Nations Conventions are rules about human rights that countries agree to follow.

We will focus on strengths



The Strategy will focus on things children, families and communities can do.

We will include ideas from children and families



Children and families are at the centre of the Strategy.

We will learn what is important to children and families.

For example

• health







- love
- play
- friendships
- culture
- community.



We will focus on the needs of First Nations people

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children have the right to grow up healthy and happy.



Culture and community are important to First Nations children and families.



The Strategy will have a strong focus on support for First Nations children and families.

We will work with First Nations people and all governments to make good programs.

We will include everyone



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languages



• care needs



- abilities
- experiences



• identities.

The Strategy will include everyone.

For example, children and families with different

• cultures and religions

We will use good information to make the Strategy



We have good information about children and families in Australia.

This information will help us make plans that meet the needs of children and families in Australia.

Why is an Early Years Strategy important?



We **must** support children in Australia to do well in life.



Most children in Australia have what they need to do well in life.





Some children in Australia do **not** get the support

they need.

For example

- good food and water



good care and safety

• good health care

• good education.



This means some children do **not** learn and grow as well as they could.



When we have good programs that help each child to learn and grow, everyone in Australia benefits.



We have a *survey* about the Strategy.


A survey is a list of questions to learn more about something.

- join a meeting.




