Our work to make the Strategy better



Australia's Disability Strategy 2021–2031 is a plan to support people with disability in all areas of their life.

In this document, we call it the Strategy.



We are doing a **review** of the Strategy.

When we review something, we check to see what:

- works well
- needs to change.



We want to know how we can make the Strategy better.



The community has shared their ideas with us about the Strategy.



We want to know what you think about the ideas we have heard so far.

This includes ideas about:



• how well the Strategy works



• how we should deliver the Strategy



• what it should focus on.

How we should deliver the Strategy



We have already heard different ideas about how we should deliver the Strategy.



We heard that governments should work better together to achieve the Strategy's goals.



Some members of the community want new Targeted Action Plans.

Our Targeted Action Plans talk about what we will do to achieve the Strategy's goals.

We heard there should be more **accessible** information for people with disability.



When information is accessible, it is easy to:

- find and use
- understand.



We heard there should be more information about how well the Strategy is going.



We also heard the Strategy should include more information about the different experiences of people with disability.

For example, people with disability from different **cultures**.

Your culture is:



- your way of life
- how you think or act now because of how you grew up
- your beliefs
- what is important to you.



We heard that we should make sure people with disability have a say about the Strategy.

What we can do to improve how we deliver the Strategy



We want to find ways to work better with all governments to deliver the Strategy.



We want to find out the best ways to make information accessible.



We want to collect better information about people with disability from different:

- communities
- backgrounds.



We want to learn as early as possible if we are not achieving the goals in the Strategy.



We want to make a plan to involve the community in more decisions about the Strategy.

What the Strategy should focus on

Employment



Employment means you:

- have a job
- go to work
- get paid.





We heard that the Strategy should focus on supporting students with disability to:

- finish their studies
- move from study to work.



We heard that the Strategy should focus on removing **barriers** that stop people with disability from working.



A barrier is something that stops you from doing something you:

- need to do
- want to do.

Housing





We heard that the Strategy should focus on ways to create more accessible housing that people can afford.

Laws





We heard that the Strategy should focus on improving laws that protect the **rights** of people with disability.



Rights are rules about how people must treat you:

- fairly
- equally.



We also heard that the Strategy should focus on ways to protect women and girls with disability from **violence**.




Violence is when someone:

- hurts you
- scares you
- controls you.



We also heard that the Strategy should focus on making the **justice system** better for people with disability.





- prisons
- the courts
- police
- the law.

Getting support





We heard that the Strategy should do more so that people with disability get the support they need.

Education





We heard that the Strategy should focus on creating a plan to make education more **inclusive**.



When something is inclusive, everyone:

- can take part
- feels like they belong.

Health





We heard the Strategy should focus on making health services more inclusive.

Attitudes





People's **attitudes** are what they:

- think
- feel
- believe.



We heard that the Strategy should focus more on ways to protect people with disability from **discrimination**.



Discrimination is when someone treats you unfairly because of a part of who you are.

This includes how services treat you.



We also heard the Strategy should focus on ways to support people with disability to be leaders in Australia.



This includes showing more people with disability in the **media**.

For example, in movies and TV shows.



Media is a way of getting information.


