1.1 What would a partnership between CSOs and the government that achieves outcomes for Australians being supported by the community sector look like?

It is not in line with the real increases in the cost of living. Our funding has also not increased over a very long time. Wages, LSL, superannuation costs, tax, etc have all increased.

Encourage the Neighbourhood House sector to continue to share their amazing stories of community engagement that leads to numerous positive outcomes.
