

with the community.




The NPA program has people who do assessment services to support the needs of people with disability in the workplace.



How many NPA providers?



We will *set a cap* on the number of providers for each area.

Set a cap means we say what the limit is for the number of providers in an area.



For example, there might be less providers in some areas and more in others.



This is to make sure assessors

have enough work to do



• can make enough money.




There will still be enough providers to deliver the assessments that are needed.



We will choose providers who can deliver good assessments for people with disability.

We want you to tell us



Should the cap on provider numbers be higher or lower?



For example

- 3 to 4 providers per area?
- 10 providers per area?



Tell us why you think this number is best.



Should there be different numbers in different areas?

For example, city areas and regional areas.




Tell us if you think there will be problems with a cap on the number of providers in an area.



Is there a number of assessment services that is not enough or too many to deliver each year?

Key Performance Indicators



Key Performance Indicators or KPIs means the measure of performance over time.



Our KPIs say that most assessment services must be done within set times.



For example, a provider must accept or reject an assessment order within 1 business day.



Set times for work to be done makes sure

 assessment orders can be given to other providers if needed



• participants are assessed quickly.
