About the NDIS Evidence Advisory Committee



The Australian Government is setting up the NDIS Evidence **Advisory Committee**.

An Advisory Committee is a group of people who



- Go to meetings
- Help make decisions
- Come from different areas.

We call it the **EAC** for short.



The EAC will be made up of **experts**.

Experts are people who know a lot about something.



They will tell the government about if different kinds of NDIS supports are

- Safe
- A good use of money.



You might pay for these with your NDIS **funding**.

Funding is **money from the government** to take part in the NDIS.



They will look at

• Therapies



Assistive technology

Assistive technology can be things to help you

- Speak
- Move
- See
- Hear.



• Equipment

Equipment is things to help you with your disability like a hoist.

Why do we need the EAC



The government did a **review** of the NDIS.

A review is when you check what

- Works
- Needs to change.



They had some **recommendations** about what to do better with the NDIS.

Recommendations are ideas to do things better.



A recommendation was for the government to set up the EAC.



EAC will make sure there is independent advice about NDIS supports.

Independent means separate to the government.



EAC will help with making good changes to the NDIS.

How will the EAC work



EAC will give recommendations to the government.

This will help the government make good changes to the NDIS.



There will be 3 sub committees.

They will help the EAC.

They will give ideas about



• Capacity building



• Assistive technology



 If different kinds of supports are safe and good use of money.



EAC will say if

• Things will be different for some groups of people with disability



• There are gaps in research

Gaps are the difference between

- What happens now
- What should happen.



Research means

- Finding out what people think about things
- Using the information to **help others**.

Who is on the EAC



The government want to have lots of different people on the EAC.

This will give the government lots of ideas.



They might be

• People with disability



 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.



People who speak languages other than English.



They might also be

• People who do research



• Health experts

They know a lot about keeping people healthy.



• People who know a lot about how much healthcare costs.



We will make sure that we follow the **policy** for **gender inclusion**.

This will make it **fair** for everyone who joins EAC.

Policies are plans for how to do things



People say what gender they are.

They might be

- A man
- A woman
- A different gender
- No gender.



Inclusion is when everyone

- Can take part
- Feels like they **belong**.

When will the EAC have meetings



The EAC will start in July 2025.



There will be meetings during the year.



In the meetings they will talk about

• Evidence for different supports

Evidence is proof that something is true.



• Give advice.
